The driver was arrested for DUI and failing to maintain a single lane of traffic. The driver felt he was racially profiled due to the color of his skin.	1.30.2020	The traffic stop was lawfully based upon probable cause for a traffic infraction. The complaint was investigated and there was no evidence to support racial profiling. The complaint was Exonerated.
20.013	2.17.2020	A black male was in the lobby of a business and called 911 for a ride home. Investigation revealed before deputies arrived, the caller threatened employees and refused to leave the business. The caller was arrested for Disorderly Conduct. The caller felt he was racially profiled due to the color of his skin.	2.27.2020	Contact with the caller occurred after a call for service was initiated by him. He was arrested based on probable cause for a misdemeanor. The complaint was investigated and there was no evidence to support racial profiling. The complaint was Exonerated.
20.043	6.13.2020	A black male driver was stopped for speeding (60/45) at 12:15 pm. Investigation revealed the driver had a suspended driver's license, in possession of marijuana, THC wax, open alcohol containers, and had 10 misdemeanor warrants from two local agencies. The driver was arrested for all the above besides speeding. The driver felt he was stopped because he was a black male. A truck in front of him was speeding too and he felt they should have been stopped instead.	7.2.2020	The traffic stop was lawfully based upon probable cause for a traffic infraction. The complaint was investigated and there was no evidence to support racial profiling. The other vehicle was speeding (57/45) but three mph less than the complainant. The complaint was Exonerated.

K.S.A. 22-4610 (d)(1) Each law enforcement agency shall compile an annual report of all complaints of racial profiling received for the period of July 1 to June 30 and shall submit the report on or before July 31 to the office of the attorney general for review. (2) The annual report shall include: (A) The number of racial or other biased-based policing complaints received; (B) the date each racial or other biased-based policing complaint is filed; (C) action taken in response to each racial or other biased-based policing complaint; (D) the disposition of each racial or other biased-based policing complaint; (E) the date each racial or other biased-based policing complaint is closed; (F) whether or not all agency law enforcement officers not exempted by Kansas commission on peace officers' standards and training received the training required in subsection (c)(2)(A); (G) whether the agency has a policy prohibiting racial or other biased-based policing; (H) whether the agency policy mandates specific discipline for sustained complaints of racial or other biased-based policing; (I) whether the agency has a community advisory board; and (J) whether the agency has a racial or other biased-based policing comprehensive plan or if it collects traffic or pedestrian stop data.
